

## **Troubleshooting Tips**

My computer does not boot-up if the player is connected prior to turning on the PC.

In order to improve the performance of your portable music player and allow a faster download experience, the storage in your device has been formatted using a larger sector size. The BIOS in some older computers does not support this larger sector size, which causes it not to recognize the device when the PC is booting-up. To correct this, simply disable the "boot from USB" option in your computer BIOS or wait until your computer has completed its boot-up sequence before connecting your portable music player.

### Note:

- USB Connection: For a reliable USB connection, your RCA player should always be set to STOP or OFF mode, before connecting to PC/USB.
- RESET: To reset your RCA player please reload the battery again.

Please take good care of this manual for future reference. The appearance of our players shown in the manual may differ from the actual products since all pictures are based on the prototype of our models.




## **Overview**



# **Operational notes**

- The following operating notes are written to enable readers to correctly use the player and keep the player in good operating condition. Please read carefully and comply strictly with the notes.
- The MP3 player should be kept in areas free from extreme temperature changes (above 35°C/95°F or below 5°C/41°F), moisture and static electricity.
- Please do not hit the player against any hard objects; do not let foreign objects enter the inner parts of the player; do not place heavy objects on the player; do not put the player in close contact with chemicals.
- If the MP3 player will not be operated for a prolonged period, remove the battery to avoid possible damage caused by electrical leakage.
- Please avoid placing the player under direct source of light or heat emitting devices; avoid places with extreme dust and smoke.
- Please do not dismantle, repair or change this player.
- Please keep a copy of the files stored in the player as the company will not be responsible for any loss of such data.

# **Basic Operations**

# Load battery

Pull out the USB cover, open the battery compartment and load one AAA battery as directed by "+"and "-" markings.



# Change battery

When the LCD displays "Low Battery", you should replace the battery with a new one. Pull out the USB cover and open the battery cover, then you can replace the old battery with a new one.



# Turning the power on/off

Shortly press "  $\blacktriangleright$  " to power on the player. Press and hold "  $\blacktriangleright$  " to power off the player.

# Two functions of this player: Music playing, Voice recording

Shortly press "M" to select music playback mode. Then press "M" to confirm. Then you can play MP3 and WMA format files under this mode. The player will automatically switch back to music mode if no operation for more than 10 seconds

Shortly press "M" button to enter music mode. Press "M" button to select voice mode and press "M" button again to confirm this mode. It is the same procedure to transfer from "voice mode" to music mode.

# Playback Mode: Play/pause/stop

Press" ▶ " once to play music.

While playing the music, the LCD shows the current playing time as the picture shows.



ROCK

To press the ▶ " again will enter pause state, press the button again to resume play.

LCD will display the pause time at the pause state, and the time will blink.




Under play or pause mode, press and hold" ▶ " button once to enter the stop mode, slightly press" ▶ " to resume play mode.



# Skipping to previous song and next song

Press" ▶▶ " button to skip to the next song, press" ◄ "button to skip to the previous song.





REW/FWD button operation will cause change of song information



Note: skip to the previous file (applicable when the current file has been played for shorter than 4 seconds)
Reverse to the beginning of the current file (applicable when the current file has been played for at least 4 seconds)

## **REW/FWD function**

Press and hold the" ▶■" for FWD, resume playing when released. Press and hold the" ◄◄ " for REW function.

The current playing time may change frequently during REW and FWD mode.



### VOL+/VOL-


By pressing VOL+ or VOL- button, you can control the volume in either Play or Pause mode.



### Repeat A-B function


Under music/voice mode, while the player is in Play or Pause mode, you can press REC button to select A and B, then A-B music or voice will play continuously, particularly convenient for learning foreign languages. Switch between "A" and "B", or cancel setting by repeatedly pressing this button.

Repeat A-B setting display




### Repeat

Press and hold "M" button repeatedly during playback will switch among Repeat one( つ), Repeat All( つ), Shuffle( つ), Shuffle Repeat



## Equalizer mode

Under music or voice mode, press and hold REC button to cyclical selection of the equalizer modes. The digital player has the below EQ settings (for another set method please refer to P.16).




# **Advanced Operations**

### **MENU function**

Briefly press " M " button to enter MENU. Press " ▶ or ◄ to do cycle selecting of the below 12 functions and press " M " to confirm your choice.

After you are familiar with basic operation of this MP3 player, we will describe more particular and advanced functional settings of the player to help you become an advanced user. It mainly includes the MENU system contained in the "Setting" MENU.





Note: Apart from the recording mode that denies access to MENU options, you can make your setting in play, pause or stop mode. The digital player will return to play mode (the last setting mode), automatically if idle for 10 seconds in this selection

# Music mode 🞵 🕟

This is the default mode of the digital player. You can play MP3 or WMA music files in this mode. You can also operate the songs with functions of REW, FWD, Volume Adjustment, Equalizer, Repeat and Shuffle(Refer to page 9-11).


# Voice mode

Press "M" button and "▶▶" button to select voice mode, then press "M" button to confirm. Under voice mode, you can select play/record/ repeat A-B/REW/FWD/VOL+,VOL-/EQ setting.

#### 1.Play/REW/FWD/VOL+,VOL-(Ref. P. 9-11)

#### 2.Voice stop mode Under voice mode, LCD displays are:

- Recorded file information
- 2 Voice status mode
- 3 Current voice file number
- 4 Number of stored voice files






Note: The recorded file only can be in WAV format not in MP3 format

#### Start recording

In voice mode under the stop state, press "REC" button to start recording, the LCD display is as follows



### Stop recording

Press "REC" button again to stop recording, LCD displays as the previous page shows.

### Playback recorded file

The operation procedure is the same as music playback (Please refer to pages 9-11).



#### Name the recorded file

For the large quantity of recorded files, it is suggested that you rename each file with an easily recognized name.




Note: You need to connect the player to the computer to rename the recorded files.




Note: A-B Segment repeat function only works under the play/pause mode and it won't work in recording or stop mode. Press "REC" for a while and then users can adjust the EQ mode only in play/pause/stop status, users can't use this function in recording mode.

## **EQ Setting**

Press " M " button to enter the MENU interface, press " ▶ or ◄ " to select the "EQUALIZER", press " M " to confirm. Press " ▶ or ◄ " to cycle through the different EQ settings and press " M " to confirm. (For another method please Ref. P.11)



When you choose the equalizer mode, you can press "▶▶ " and "◄ "
to highlight the CUSTOM mode. Press "M" to enter CUSTOM settings.
Then press "▶▶ " or "◄ " to choose the frequency range to be adjusted,
press "+" or "-" to adjust the frequency level."



### Repeat mode

Press " M " button to enter the MENU interface, Press " ▶ or ◄ " to select " REPEAT " and press " M " to confirm. Then press " ▶ or ◄ " to cycle the repeat mode, total 5 repeat modes are available. Press " M " to confirm selection.



### **Power Save**

This function consists of five different idle time settings while the digital player is in music mode or voice mode. The digital player will be switched off automatically after the idle period for saving battery. The digital player can also be set to forbid automatic switch-off. Press " M " to enter the MENU screen, then press " ▶ or ◄ " to select "POWER SAVE". Press " M " to confirm. Then press " ▶ or ◄ " to cycle through the options, press " M " to confirm.





Note: The "POWER SAVE" function will not work under playing or recording mode.

### **Backlight**

This consists of three settings of backlight: Disable, which turns off the backlight; Variable time settings (1-20sec), backlight will time out when there is no button activation. Once timed out, any button will bring the backlight back on; Always On, the backlight is always on. Press " M " to enter the MENU screen, then press " ▶ or ◄ " to select "BACKLIGHT". Press " M " to confirm. Then press " ▶ or ◄ " to cycle through the options, press " M " to confirm.

This item includes 7 types of backlight color. You can select your favorite color and the corresponding color will display when you are operating the player. Press " M " to enter the MENU screen, then press " ▶ "or " ◀ " to select "COLOR". Press " M " to confirm. Then press " ▶ or | ◀ " to select different backlight colors and press " M " to confirm.

# Language

There are various types of languages to choose . Press " M " to enter the MENU screen, then press " ▶ or |◄ " to select " LANGUAGE" press " M " to confirm. Then press " ▶ or |◄ " to select different languages and press " M " to confirm.




### Delete files

Press " M " to enter the MENU screen, then press " ▶▶) or |<a href="#">✓ "to select "DELETE". Press " M " to confirm your selection.</a>



Press " ▶ or I◀ " to select among "Music File", "Voice File" or "Exit".

Press "M" to confirm. Press " +/- " to select " Yes/No ", Press
" ▶ or I◀ " to choose the file you want to delete. Press " M " button to confirm.



When the file is deleted, it displays as below and returns to the status as the last picture shows, you can return to delete MENU by pressing " > ". When the last Music/Voice file has been deleted, it will return to delete MENU automatically.

### System information

Press " M " to enter the MENU interface, press " ▶ Hor I◄ " button to select "ABOUT", and press " M " to confirm. The unit information will be displayed as below:

### **FXIT**

Press "M" to enter the MENU interface, press "▶▶) or |◀◀" button to select "EXIT" then press "M" to confirm.



# **Connect with computer**



Connect the player to the computer with the USB cable provided or directly connect.

# Installation of the connection software


No additional driver software is required for Windows Me, Windows 2000, Windows XP after connecting the player to the computer via USB. It will be recognized automatically as a "Removable drive" for Windows 98 SE, please install the driver software from CD-ROM provided.



# Save and rename downloaded music and voice files

After successfully connecting the player to the computer, it will appear as a "Removable disk", double click this disk, it will show as following:







Note: While the file is deleted, it will create voice file again once users do recording.



Note: This player can recognize and play the music file in .MP3 format and .WMA format, the voice file in .WAV format.

The operating procedure of the removable flash disk is the same as normal USB storage device. Users may copy files to relevant folder. You may also rename it for your own convenience.



# **Disconnect from computer**

For Windows 2000, from the System Tray, double click the left mouse button on the icon and select Safely Remove Hardware. Select the drive corresponding to your player and click STOP.



The Stop a Hardware device screen appears. Select the device to be stopped again for confirmation and click OK.



You can also stop your player by left clicking on the icon from the system tray and selecting the drive corresponding to your player. Before disconnecting the USB connection from the computer or the Digital Audio Player, be sure the "Safe to Remove Hardware" message is displayed.



#### Note:

1.DO NOT unplug the player from the computer's USB port until Windows prompts that it is safe to do so. Otherwise data loss or even physical damage to the player may occur. Our company will not be responsible for any damage/loss acaused by inappropriate operation.
